Volunteer FAQs

What should I bring? You may want to bring a water bottle and snack. Habitat will provide a water cooler, cups, and all tools and equipment. Please leave valuables at home.

What should I wear? Comfortable clothes that you would not mind getting dirty or covered in paint. Closed-toe athletic shoes or work boots are required – no sandals or Crocs.

What if it's raining on the day of my shift? Depending on the stage of construction, we may or may not be able to work. Habitat will update the weather hotline at (919) 932-7077 option 1 by 7:15am in case of weather-related cancellation.

How old do I have to be to volunteer at the worksite? Volunteers must be at least 16 years old to work on new home construction. All minor volunteers must have a waiver signed by a parent or guardian on file prior to volunteering.
