University UMC Giving Calendar

For our University UMC family, compassion remains a foundational spiritual practice. Examining the needs of our community and finding tangible means of support is a dedicated focus. Throughout the next year, we will highlight each of our mission partners as indicated in the Giving Calendar below. These mission partners provide opportunities to support organizations who make a difference in the lives of our community members. Prayerfully discern how you might assist in each endeavor, ensuring that vital resources are committed to works of hope and compassion.



Seeking to put God's love into action, Habitat for Humanity of Orange County brings people together to build homes, communities, and hope. Through the use of volunteer labor and donations of money and materials, Habitat builds homes for families in need. In addition to building new homes, Habitat also partners with families who live in non-Habitat homes to assist them in making repairs to their homes such as exterior painting, siding repairs, or cleaning, repairing, or installing ramps and handrails, etc.

Each Lent from 2023-2025, University UMC is raising a grand total of \$50,000 to help sponsor the new community center at Habitat for Humanity's Weavers Grove housing development.

IFC provides hot meals, a food pantry, emergency housing, transitional housing, emergency financial assistance, and advocacy in an effort to confront the causes and respond to the effects of poverty in our community.

During the Easter Season, University UMC will support the Interfaith Council for Social Service through Project 5,000. Based on an unforgettable experience in the life of Jesus – the feeding of the 5,000 – this food drive encourages us to give our own small contribution of food and see it multiplied into greater usefulness. Participants donate boxes of food designed to provide emergency food for a family of four for two days.

Communiversity is an after-school program run by the Sonja Haynes Stone Center and UNC student volunteers, providing cultural literacy enrichment, academic enhancement, and mentor relationships for K-5 students in the Chapel Hill-Carrboro City Schools. This program is housed at University UMC as part of our commitment to work with the Chapel Hill-Carrboro schools to bridge the second-largest achievement gap between black and white students in the U.S.

During the months of June and July, University UMC will raise money to support Communiversity. Donations of individually wrapped snacks for students are welcome at University UMC throughout the academic year.

TABLE's mission is to provide healthy, emergency food aid every week to hungry elementary school children living in Chapel Hill and Carrboro. Food for TABLE is grown at the Giving Garden. TABLE currently has on average 800 local kids enrolled in their TABLE@Home program. Every week, with the help of our volunteers, these children receive bags filled with healthy, fresh food delivered directly to their homes.

During the month of November, University UMC will hold a Thanksgiving food collection for TABLE.

Through a global network of local organizations, Zoe Empowers provides a scalable and sustainable framework in which vulnerable youth-led African families are equipped to become safe and healthy, skilled for long-term success, and supported within their community. University UMC members John & Erika Lusk attended a mission trip with ZOE to Tanzania in October 2023. The Lusks invite you to attend a future trip with them to Africa with ZOE Empowers.

This year University UMC will provide \$9,000 through its budgeted giving to support the work of ZOE Empowers.


Sign up to purchase or cook an item for Wesley Fellowship Dinners. Volunteers are also needed to help prep and serve the food.
