# Welcome to University United Methodist Church

*Maundy Thursday*, also known as *"Holy Thursday,"* recalls the new commandment *(mandatum novum* in Latin) Jesus gave to his disciples in John 13:34, "that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another." On this night, Christians commemorate the Passover supper Jesus shared with his disciples before his crucifixion, instituting the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper. A service of Tenebrae or "darkness" is based on a twelfth-century service with meditation on the passion of Christ The ancient practice of stripping the Lord's table and sanctuary following communion is a dramatic way of showing the desolation and abandonment of the long night in Gethsemane and what followed.
